## A-Trustee Elections – Voting open

**Voting papers and information about the candidates will be sent to eligible customers on Thursday 31 August 2023.**

The election will be held by postal voting under the First Past the Post electoral system.

All Waitomo Energy Services Customer Trust customers connected to the network as at Friday 28 July 2023 are eligible to vote and will receive one vote only per customer.

Where customers are listed in joint or entity names they will be entitled to appoint a representative to exercise the vote on behalf of the entity or joint customers.
